PRESIDENT'S LETTER

WHAT ARE YOU DOING ON TUESDAY, MAY 27TH, AT 7PM?

I hope your answer is that you will be with us for our 20th annual member meeting. This meeting is our opportunity as the members and future of Kol Ami to:

- Hear and dialogue about how we did in the past year
- Converse about our new strategic plan and what we are looking to accomplish over the next five years, and next year in particular
- Dialogue and approve next year's operating budget and any other resolutions the Board of Trustees brings to the members
- Vote on the slate of returning and new Board members that our Nominating Committee has developed and whom we will rely on to guide our congregation

ADAM FISHBEIN BECOMES TOURETTE SYNDROME AMBASSADOR



On March 18-20, I went to Arlington, VA, with my mom to participate in the training of the 2014 class of Tourette Syndrome Association (TSA) Youth Ambassadors. Youth Ambassadors visit schools and religious institutions to teach their peers about Tourette Syndrome (TS), usually at the request of a student who has TS and is being mistreated or bullied. During this training, I learned many valuable and interesting lessons about what TS is and how to raise awareness about it, and also I learned a lot about myself.

In my experience as a teen with TS, I have a hard time distinguishing what is a tic and what is a habit. For example, I learned that there is a kind of tic called "echolalia," which is when someone repeats what other people say without being able to help it. I didn't realize it before, but I have that kind of tic. That was very powerful for me.

Another realization hit me when I was at that training. I was around 46 other teens with TS. All of them were amazing, nice, funny, wonderful people with the inconvenience of having TS. They may be misunderstood in other places, but during those two days, they were surrounded by people who understood. They were surrounded by people who are going through the same thing as they are. Not only did people understand, but they didn't care. They didn't care about the twitches or the yelling that their body makes them do without permission. They were at home. I was too.

On March 20, everyone at the training took a shuttle to Capitol Hill. This is where we spent the day lobbying to our Congresspeople about TS. We asked our representatives to approve the federal funding that the TSA was asking for. Here are our three requests: 1) the signing onto of the "Dear Colleague" letter which asked for appropriations to fund the education of educators and medical professionals about TS (did you know it takes four years on average for a person to be diagnosed?); 2) to join the Bicameral Congressional Tourette Syndrome Caucus; and 3) to support the renewal of the CARE Act, which asked for funding from the National Institutes of Health to do research about TS

The experience I had was one that I will remember my whole life, and I hope my story inspires you to contribute in some way to a cause you care about as much as I care about raising awareness about TS.

About a week ago, I started a fund-raiser on CrowdRise to support the purchase of materials and travel for my work as a Youth Ambassador. If you are interested in donating, please go to http://www.crowdrise.com/adamfishbein. I am actively looking for opportunities to visit schools and synagogues as a Youth Ambassador. 

JEWISH RELIEF AGENCY

Come out and help sort, pack, and deliver food to needy families on at the Jewish Relief Agency Food Distribution Center. The Jewish Relief Agency is a dynamic, volunteer-driven organization whose goal is to help Jews in need. Since its

founding in 2000, JRA has been bringing together individuals of all means, ages, and backgrounds each month in a spirit of community and *tikun olam*. Through the efforts of JRA's community of more than 10,000 volunteers, monthly food-relief packages are provided to 2,750 low-income families in the Greater Philadelphia area.

JRA food distributions take place one Sunday each month throughout the year at their warehouse in Northeast Philadelphia. Volunteers work together to package kosher, non-perishable food in boxes. After packing, volunteers load their cars and deliver the food packages to each of the recipient families according to pre-determined delivery routes, complete with driving directions and maps. Most delivery routes take between 30 to 60 minutes to complete.

ROCHELLE MARCUS DINKIN FROM APRIL 8 TO JUNE 9

Artist Rochelle Marcus Dinkin was raised in Philadelphia, where she received a Board of Education Scholarship for all four years. She attended the Pennsylvania Academy of Fine Arts for four years as a painting major, and culminated her education at the Philadelphia College of Art with a BA in Fine Arts.

She worked as a full-time artist, having 30 one-woman shows despite raising five children and working in the Psych Ward at Temple University as an Art Therapist for 10 years. She has shown her work locally and nationally to great acclaim. In the 1980s, she was selected for the prestigious Fleishman Memorial Challenge in cooperation with the Philadelphia Museum of Art.



Her entire career has focused on the female narrative, represented by the central character of the heroine. In the 2000s, she and her closest friend formed "Grimmsistersart. com," where they showed their work together successfully at many art venues.

The Kol Ami gallery hours are Wednesday from 4:00 to 8:00 p.m. and Sunday from 10:00 a.m. to noon. If the Religious School is closed on those days, the gallery is closed as well. 


