### FROM RABBI BERKOWITZ

#### A LETTER FROM CAMP

(As I hum "Hello Muddah, Hello Faddah")

Dear Kol Ami Family:

As I write this, I'm waiting for my camp laundry to be done. It doesn't seem to matter how long I'm gone... there are always four loads of laundry. There is also a tension between wanting to sleep for a week and wanting to stay up all night telling all my camp stories before I forget them. Which is why I am writing this letter.

I have just spent two weeks as faculty at the Union for Reform Judaism Six Points Creative Arts Academy at the Westtown School in Westtown, PA. In addition to 11 regional camps (ours is URJ Camp Harlam), there are now five specialty camps serving all of North America: two Science and Technology camps, two Sports camps, and, as of last year, the CAA.

Like many of my colleagues, I've been waiting for a long time for the URJ to develop a program for young Jewish artists. CAA provides this experience for students from 4th to 12th grade.

Experienced arts mentors offer campers the opportunity to "major" in Dance, Visual Arts, Culinary Arts, Instrumental Music, Vocal Music, Classical and Contemporary Theater, Musical Theater, or Creative Writing. In addition, arts mentors, faculty, and counselors put together "minors" like Healthy Cooking, Theater Tech, or the First Chapter of Your Novel.

Each day there is one period of Kinesthetic Arts (mostly dance parties and low-stakes kickball) and an all-camp evening program that ranges from solving the Mystery of the Missing Birthday Banana to performing in a Lip-Sync Battle with your bunk.

I worked with the Creative Writing major and the Novel-Writing minor, advising writers ages 8 to 14, who were creating everything from middle-grade novels to epic poems. I also wrote a little myself, including a piece that will be featured in this year's High Holy Day services.

We start off each day with a "Mo Moment" (short for *modeh/modah ani*, our morning prayer of thanks). The community sings some short prayers in four-part harmony. Faculty and leadership set an intention grounded in one of the camp's core values: Creativity, Craftsmanship, Curiosity, Collaboration, and Grit. At the end of the day, we bring everyone together in a *siyyum*, a reflection on what we've created and learned that day.

This summer, we also created work on a larger theme, Hillel's famous saying: "If I am not for myself, who will be for me? If I am only for myself, what am I? And if not now, when?"

Shabbat at CAA is magical. On Thursday, everyone at camp is assigned to a discipline, not necessarily their major, and given a prayer to interpret. It's not unusual for *Kabbalat Shabbat* to include interpretive dance, art installations, and a "Jewsical" on the weekly *Torah* portion. And, of course, we bake our own *challah*.

At the end of the session, campers put on a showcase for their families and the local community. It is incredible to see how each camper makes a unique contribution, how each artist grows in such a short time, and what our young people can accomplish in a place where they feel safe, nurtured, and challenged, all at the same time. After two weeks of being surrounded by young artists, working on my own art, I felt like I had grown as well.

If you're wondering how you can help more young people have these great experiences, you've already made one contribution: me. Kol Ami, and other URJ congregations, donate their rabbis, cantors, and educators to serve as dedicated Jewish professionals at each camp (meaning that the camp only pays us in donuts from the nearby Amish Market!)

You can also mark your calendars for a concert to benefit the URJ Six Points Creative Arts Academy on <u>Sunday</u>, <u>November 10</u>, at 1:30 p.m., right here at Kol Ami.

- Our first erev Rosh Hashanah service was held on September 5, 1994, at Abington Friends School.
- Our first Friday-night service was held on September 9, 1994, at Gratz College.
- In the first edition of the Bulletin in 1994, Founding Rabbi Elliot Holin wrote, "Kol Ami (The Voice of our People) is aptly named because our pledge to one another is to be here for, and to hear, each other ... to treat each child, youth, and adult as sacred created in the Divine Image."
- Also in that first issue, the Synagogue was advertising a trip to the Philadelphia Museum of Art to see "Cezanne to Matisse: Great French Paintings of the Barnes Foundation" this was when the Barnes was still in Merion, before it relocated to Center City in 2012.
- Additionally, Kol Ami's upcoming second seder, "The Days of Wine and Charoses," was being promoted, and Executive Director's Elaine Stevens' title was "Treasurer."

Janet comes from a long line of Jewish social activists. Her maternal grandmother was president of the *B'nai Brith* chapter in Forest Hills. Her paternal great-uncle was a founder of HIAS in 1901, and her great-grandparents spent 20 years running HIAS during WW II and helped thousands of Jews escape from Germany and other Nazioccupied countries. This history informs Janet's work in ways she will describe.

ROBERTA SCHLESINGER - SEPT. 3-OCT. 15




Roberta Schlesinger is a master botanical artist and illustrator. Her depictions of flowers and plants have been critiqued as "exquisite - with a stunning attention to detail." Her work has been shown in botanical art exhibitions, earning her Best-of-Show and First-Place awards from Ringling College, Florida Botanical Art Society, and the International Water-Gardening Society. She studied with master artist, Olivia Braida-Chuisano, and Ringling College of Art in Sarasota, FL.

Ms. Schlesinger is also a watercolor portraitist/collage artist whose creations have been included in the International "Embracing our Differences Exhibit" (2017 and 2019), chosen from 11,400+ entries from 41 countries. Her retrospective, solo show in Georgetown, TX, in March 2019 featured more than 70 works in two galleries.

Roberta is also a Montessori/International Baccalaureate art teacher/program director. She is a member of the American Society of Botanical Artists and served as the exhibition chair for Capital City Scribes in Austin. Originally from WV, she lived for many years in MA and has also resided in FL and TX. Everywhere she lives, she draws and paints the flowers around her, from Florida's tropical plants to the wildflowers of Texas. She now lives with her husband and children in their old/new home in Pennsylvania. She teaches adults and children in her Elkins Park studio.

#### INTERFAITH HOUSING ALLIANCE PARTICIPATION UPDATE

In the first week of June, a group of volunteers from Kol Ami helped to support three Montgomery County homeless families at the Ambler Church of the Brethren through the Interfaith Housing Alliance (IHA). IHA is a non-profit organization that has been providing housing and supportive services for homeless families in Montgomery County for over 25 years. IHA and the volunteer congregations provide temporary housing to the families in local churches and synagogues with the help of volunteers in the interfaith community.

During our volunteer week, we provided dinners; sat with the families during the meal to get to know them; and stayed overnight at the church where the families lived for the months of May and June. This is about the fifth year that we have buddied with a local congregation to support these families in need, and we intend to keep it going. All of our volunteers had a very meaningful experience.


